GENERAL RULES

- All specimens exhibited in the Horticultural and Honey Section must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor or of his employer and have been produced by either for a period of not less than two months prior to the Show. Scrutineers will be appointed to visit gardens or apiary where necessary.
- The Show marquee will be open for the staging of exhibits on the Wednesday prior to the Show from 12 noon to 8.00p.m. and from 7.30a.m. to 9.00a.m. on the day of the Show, after which time all exhibitors must retire from the marquee in readiness for judging at 9.30a.m.. **FLORAL ART EXHIBITS** must be executed in the marquee. Please use Green Lane entrance.
- Exhibitors must not remove or dispose of their exhibits before 6.00p.m. on the day of the Show. Prize money will be paid at 5.00p.m. and exhibits must be removed by 7.00p.m.**
- Exhibitors will receive their Benching Cards in the marquee, these to be placed (reversed) in front of or on the exhibit. Any exhibit without a card will be considered not for judging.
- No unauthorised person shall enter the marquee after judging commences until the marquee is officially opened.
- The Judges shall have power to award, withhold or amend prizes, their decision shall be final except where breach of the rules is discovered. Only the signed award of the Judges will be accepted as evidence that a prize has been won. The production of a prize card will not entitle any exhibitor to a prize. All protests must be delivered to the Show Secretary (in writing) before 2.00p.m. on the day of the Show together with the sum of £1.
- No exhibitor shall act as a Judge or Steward in the section in which he or she exhibits.
- In line with other shows, we have amalgamated the Open and Amateur classes.
- Initial entries must be sent to the Secretary by the closing date. **Exhibitors making entries to the value of £6.00 or more in any combination of sections will receive a free Pass to the Show.** Entries must be accompanied by the correct fees. Additional entries, substitutions or amendments will be accepted at time of staging. Fees payable prior to closing date.
- The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage sustained and it is only on this understanding that entries will be accepted.
- Point awarded as follows:- 1st Prize - 3 Points; 2nd Prize - 2 Points; 3rd prize - 1 Point. An Exhibitor can claim only one set of points per Class.
- All Cups offered to the Society, which will become the property of the Society, and Cups won at previous shows, must be handed over within ONE calander month prior to the Show.

- All extracted Honey shall be graded for colour with grading Classes approved by the British Bee-Keepers Association.

Preparation: Preheat oven to 180C/350F/gas mark 4. Cream butter and honey
together. Beat eggs well and add alternately with sifted flour and salt. (Save a little
flour to add with sultanas). Beat all well and lightly. A little milk may be added if
necessary. Fold in sultanas and stir well. To cook: Prepare a round tin approx
