DENBIGHSHIRE AND FLINTSHIRE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY LTD GENERAL RULES

- No Prizes shall be offered from the funds of the Society which have not been sanctioned by the Management Committee, and the Society reserves to itself the power to withhold any Prize or Prizes where the Judges say there is not sufficient merit.
- Only the signed the Judges Books are accepted by the Society as evidence that a prize has been awarded.
- 3. 1st and 2nd Prize Winners only, in appropriate Classes, go forward for their Section Championship and Grand Parade. 1st & 2nd Prize-winners must appear in the Grand Parade.
- 4. The decision of the Judges in all cases will be final, except where fraud, misrepresentation or breach of the Rules is discovered. In the case of any dispute as to the height of the animal exhibited the current rules of the Joint Measurement Scheme Ltd. Will apply which can be obtained from the Secretary of the Joint Measurement Scheme Ltd., British Equestrian Centre, PO Box 322, Horley, RH6 0WS.
- 5. In the case of any dispute as to the age of any animal entered as being of a specified age the Steward shall call in the Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society for the purpose of whose decision (unless the animal has been accepted for Registration by its Stud or Society) shall be final, and such animal if not eligible for the Class in which it is entered, shall be disqualified.
- 6. The Society, acting through the Management Committee, reserves the right to refuse any entries without assigning a reason for so doing, and to cancel or abandon any Class or section at any time prior to or on the day of the Annual Show, if there are fewer than three exhibitors.
- 7. All exhibitors are required to have adequate insurance and public liability cover for their stock.
- 8. No animal shall have its teats sealed during the Show nor shall the udder be in any way 'faked'.
- 9. In hand Stallions should be shown by handlers over 16 years on Show day.
- 10. The Stock exhibited must not be distinguished during judging by any means which denotes their ownership, but solely by an exhibit number fixed to each Exhibit which will be sent by the Secretary before the Show and will correspond with the number in the Catalogue.
- 11. No Substitution of animals will be allowed after closing date of entries, except where the affiliated society approves the change and in the Jumping Classes as permitted under British Show jumping Rule 73.9.
- 12. All persons in charge of Horses, on behalf of the Exhibitor must be acquainted with the various particulars required to be carried out regarding the Stock they have in their charge and must be ready to bring out their animals when required to do so by the Stewards. Exhibitors are responsible for seeing that their animals are led by competent persons, and no person under the age of 16 years shall be permitted to handle stallions.
- 13. The Show Ground Manager shall have power to elect his own Superintendents and Stewards, who must be non-Exhibitors in their own Section. All officials at the Show to work under the supervision of the Show Ground Manager.
- 14. All protests must be delivered in writing to the Secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the judging of the Class, unless a satisfactory reason is assigned for the delay, together with a fee of £25. All protests will be heard by the Management Committee within one month after the day of the Show except that, whenever possible, protests will be considered and settled on the Showground by the Chairman of the Management Committee and the various Superintendents who will report such decision to the Management Committee at their next meeting.
- 15. The Society will most anxiously care for the safety of the exhibits, and for any other property entrusted to them, but it must be distinctly understood by the Exhibitors and Purchasers of any exhibits and all other persons, that the Society will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any exhibit, boxes, hampers, collars, or any other property during transit or at the Exhibition whether arising from accident or any other cause whatever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants, or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 16. All Exhibitors and their employees, and all other persons admitted to the Showground shall be subject to the rules and regulations as interpreted by the Management Committee of the Denbighshire and Flintshire Agricultural Society Ltd.

- 17. No additional classes shall be added to the Schedule after publication except any of a minor nature and that only at the consent of the Chairman of the Management Committee and his Officers.
- 18. Postponement or abandonment. Exhibitors shall not have any claim against the Society or any member of the Society in respect of any loss or damage whatsoever consequent upon the Show failing (for whatever reason) to be held.
- 19. Entry fees. Under no circumstance will Entry fees be returned in the case of cancellation of entries by an exhibitor or postponement or cancellation of the Show for whatever reason.

BY ORDER OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- The relevant committee chairman has the discretion to change the timing of Judging classes and location as and when necessary.
- 21. This Show will be run in accordance with Welsh government regulations current at the time and all exhibitors must comply fully with guidelines laid down. Any exhibitor or exhibit not conforming will be refused entry to the show fields and no refunds will be made.

This Show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 24-097. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held in August 2025. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com. Only "coloured" horses and ponies (as defined in the current CHAPS UK Members' Handbook) may compete in these classes.

This competition is open to mares, geldings, and CHAPS (UK) graded stallions are permitted, excluding in Section A. Ponies must be four years old or over, to be registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of, the main body of the stud books of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA). Stallions are required to wear stallion discs in order to compete. All Riders and owners must be Members of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society, The Showing Register, or the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association. Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

These classes are qualifying classes for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 9th-13th October 2024. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

This class will be divided into five sections, the Junior Ridden will run first:

- Class LH 004. Coloured Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Pony of the Year Sponsored by CHAPS (UK) / The White Crow, ponies up to and including 148cms.
- Class LH 005. Coloured Ridden Native/Cob/Traditional Horse of the Year Sponsored by CHAPS (UK) / EGL Stud and Livery, horses exceeding 153cms.

Junior Qualifier: Please note that at Horse of the Year Show, ponies must not compete in both the Junior Coloured Ridden Pony of the Year and the Coloured Ridden Pony of the Year classes. The pony will compete in the class in which it qualifies first during the season. Riders and ponies may compete in both section A, section B and section D at HOYS qualifiers. Once a pony has qualified in either section A, section B or section D, it will no longer be eligible to compete in the section in which it has not qualified. - 1. The qualifying period is September 5th in any one year to September 6th in the following year. Qualification in this period will make you eligible to appear in the Championship at the Victoria Foods Carriage Driving Extravaganza Show immediately following the close of the qualifying period.
- 2. This competition is open to Exercise and Pleasure Vehicles only, drawn by any horse, pony, or donkey, harnessed as a single, pair or tandem of any height or breed to a two or four wheeled vehicle. Show wagons, trade turnouts, private drive vehicles, or any other type of turnout not fitting the above category are not eligible. pneumatic tyres are permitted on exercise vehicles
- 3. Once qualified, the carriage, horse or horses and whip must be presented in the championship as it was when qualified, the turnout cannot be changed in any way. If the same turnout is qualified twice or more in the same year driven by different whips only the first qualified will be eligible.
- 4. The qualifying rosette will be presented at a show which has affiliated to Victoria Food Limited.
- 5. The qualifying rosette will be presented to the exercise or pleasure drive champion, or the winner of the exercise/pleasure drive class at shows without a championship, should the champion or class winner have previously qualified, the reserve champion or second in the class will become eligible to qualify, in the event that both champion and reserve or first and second in a class have previously qualified the rosette will be presented to the champion or class winner.
- 6. A competitor is allowed to qualifier a max of two turnouts but will only be allowed to enter the championship with one turnout and is not allowed to substitute a driver.
- 7. The organizers of the national competition reserve the right to scrutinize all qualifying entries and may reject any found to have contravened or misinterpreted these rules
- 8. Exercise and Pleasure Driving vehicles will be a combined Victoria Foods Championship

Private Driving class for 138cms & under, Ponies 138CMS & under, 4 years old & over. Open to be single, pair or tandem. To be driven to a traditional type vehicle, traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyre vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible. Each Young Driver must be accompanied in the Vehicle by a competent adult aged 18 years old and over on show day. This will be judged on the ability of the Young Driver.

Class LH 007.

Private Driving class for over 138cms, Horse & Ponies over 138CMS 4 years old & over. Open to be single, pair or tandem. To be driven to a traditional type vehicle, traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyre vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible. Each Young Driver must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent adult aged 18 years old and over on show day. This will be judged on the ability of the Young Driver.

Class LH 008.

Young Driver, Open to drivers aged 17 & under on show date driving traditional/traditional-type vehicles or an exercise vehicle fitted with traditional/traditional type wheels. Lamps need not be carried. This class is judged to determine the capabilities of the driver, and particular attention will be paid to the dress, turnout and driving procedure. A competent, experienced adult groom aged 18 years or over to be carried at all times.

This is a Victoria Food Company junior championship qualifier. The champion or Class winner will qualify for the grand final to be held on Sunday 10th September 2024 if champion or class winner has qualified the rosette can be handed down at the Bury Farm

Equestrian Club, New Bury Farm, Mill Road Slapton, Bucks, LU7 9BT. Once qualified, the horse, whip and vehicle may not be changed. The whip will be awarded the Peter Howell qualifying memorial rosette.

Drivers must have attained their 8th birthday and be under 17 years old on show day. Each Young Driver must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent adult. This will be judged on the ability of the Young Driver. BDS Wales Driving Championships Qualifiers: for highest placed competitor who stables their horse in Wales BDS Wales Driving Championship Qualifier Rosette.

All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat that meets the latest safety regulations when in a carriage or in attendance. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the showground and for all young drivers in any class.

Class LH 009.

Exercise Vehicle, Single, Pairs or Tandem **BDS WALES NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP 2024 QUALIFIER**

Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

Class LH 010.

Pleasure Driving, Pleasure Driving Classes are for newcomers to showing. Open to horses, ponies, donkeys & mules, 4 years old or over.
